

Year 1 Homework


- Daily reading This is extremely important and should be a priority for home learning. Bring your reading record into school every day. This is also a useful means of communication.
- Weekly: Maths and English Set on a Wednesday and returned by Monday. 10 minutes should be allocated for each of these.
- CEW focus- These are words that you could practise reading at speed. If you child is confident with these, they could practise spelling them.

Reading Records and Reading Karate

To celebrate reading in Year 1, we follow the our whole school Reading Karate approach. After every landmark read your child will receive a different coloured band and should aim to collect the whole set!



Please comment when you have read with your child. Children should read at home at least 4 times a week.

It is important for your child to read aloud to an adult to check that words are being read accurately. It also supports your child in developing their fluency skills and comprehension when being asked questions

about the text.





Golden Rules

Golden Time and Classroom Rewards

- Children get 30 minutes of Golden Time each week.
- As a year group, children can choose between two different activities each week.
- If Golden Time is lost, there will always be an opportunity to earn it back.
- Children move up the chart for good behaviour for learning, never down. On reaching the top, children earn stickers for their chart. Once the chart is full they can choose a prize from the box.

Phonics Screening

• The phonics screening check is a statutory requirement for all children in Year 1 which takes place each year in the summer term. It is a quick check of your child's ability to decode words using only their phonic knowledge. It helps us to confirm whether your child has met the expected standard for a child at the end of Year 1. Children who have not yet met the expected standard will take the check again at the end of Year 2.
