Parables

When Jesus wanted to teach a particular lesson to a crowd of people, he would often tell them parables.

Jesus told parables so people could remember and understand what he had taught them.

How Do Christians Use the Bible?

Christians read the Bible because it contains rules and advice from God. They may talk to other Christians about what it means to them.

Some Christians study the Bible. This means that they read and think about it in detail, to gain a better understanding of God.

Key Vocabulary	
psalms	Poems and songs recorded in the Bible.
parables	A story told by Jesus, to teach a particular lesson.
proverbs	Wise sayings recorded in the Bible.
Gospels	Four books in the New Testament that tell us about Jesus' life, from his birth up to his death and resurrection.
prophecy	A message given by God, that is delivered to his people by a specially chosen person (a prophet).
