Year 6 Homework


- **Daily** reading Bring your reading record into school every day. This is also a useful means of communication but please ensure your child is aware of any messages they should be passing on.
- Weekly: Maths and English Set on a Wednesday and returned on Mondays. 10 minutes should be allocated for each of these. Your child may take more or less time to complete these and should aim to reach the end. We will also be setting a weekly arithmetic challenge.
- Practise times tables (up to 12x12) and corresponding division facts

Reading Records and Rewards

To reward reading in Year 6, we will still use the Reading Karate colours and use our familiar system. Instead of receiving bands this year, Y6 children will earn certificates and should aim to collect the whole set!



As always, please support your child to complete their reading record. Children should read at home at least 4 times a week. As well as reading for pleasure in 'their heads', it is also important for children to read aloud to an adult to practise their fluency and also to talk about what they

have read.

We recognise Year 6 as being a year that can feel quite different to the rest of a child's journey at King Charles – exciting and daunting at the same time.


With this in mind, different KC adults volunteer as mentors for small groups of children. These groups meet once a week at lunchtime.

Consequences are also in place to support children.

Golden Time and Classroom Rewards

- Golden Time is there for each child to keep and lasts for 30 minutes, once a week
- As a class, children can choose what do from different activities
- If Golden Time is lost, there will always be an opportunity to earn it back
- Children move up the chart for good behaviour for learning, never down. On reaching the top, children earn a sticker for their chart. Once the chart is full they can choose a prize from the box.

Y6 Educational Visits

During the year, to **enhance** our learning beyond the classroom, we would to take the children on visits. These visits may include trips to Falmouth Library and Art Gallery.

- This year, we also hope to visit the Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro for an Ancient Egyptian workshop – possibly travelling by train and combining this with a visit to the cathedral. (Approximately £10)
- Also, in the Autumn term, we would like to visit the Eden Project for a workshop called 'Darwin's Doodles'. (Approximately £12)
- We will also explore different parts of Falmouth, as part of our Lister Street and WWII learning.

KS2 SATs

At the end of Year 6, children in England sit tests in:

- Reading
- Maths
- Grammar, punctuation and spelling (SPaG)

These tests are both **set and marked externally**, and the results are used to measure the school's performance (for example, through reporting to Ofsted and published league tables). Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment.

The tests will be sat in the week beginning 8th May 2023 over 4 days.



KS2 SATs

Transition to secondary school

- The closing date for secondary school places is normally 31st October. Usually, you will be notified of your child's secondary school place in March.
- Each school has their own plan for transition which we will informed of in the summer term.
- We will work with each school to ensure the best possible transition for your child.
- On the last day of Y6, we will hold a leavers' assembly to which families will be invited.
