## Welcome Mr Richards

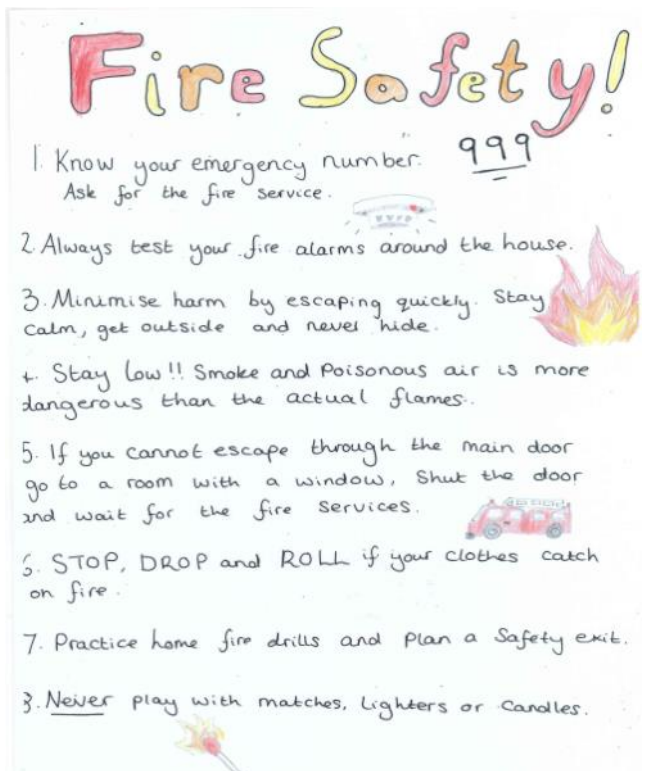

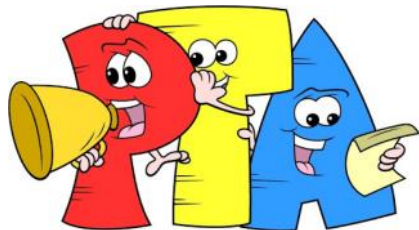
